PARK ELEMENTARY SCHOOL: A FOND FAREWELL

In March 2024, the Wichita Board of Education announced plans to consolidate six elementary schools to address funding gaps in the 2025 fiscal year budget. Unfortunately, one of our adopted schools was earmarked for closure. We take comfort in knowing that the students we've come to know and love at Park Elementary will continue to thrive under the instruction and care of their new schools. We were honored to build relationships in support of their incredible community of students, parents, teachers and administrators, and we'll be forever grateful for the many cherished memories they gave us in return.



HOW WE HELP

The secret to success for our Adopt-A-School partnership has always been the close collaboration with teachers and administrators to maximize the impact of every dollar and every hour we spend. As in years past, we organized our plans around four areas of need: classroom enhancements, teacher appreciation, community building and mentorship.

CLASSROOM ENHANCEMENTS

To lay the foundation for academic success, a safe and comfortable environment is needed so students can focus solely on learning. Close collaboration with the teachers of Harry Street and Park Elementary resulted in an efficient distribution of resources tailored for each classroom and the needs of individual students. From snacks to supplies to stools, no request was too big or too small. Our teachers knew precisely what their pupils needed, and we were happy to supply it.

- After-school club supplies, snacks and volunteer support.
- Interactive tools to support Park's special education program.
- Welcome gifts for new staff members at Harry Street.
- Supplies for Harry Street's Meaningful Work program.
- Flexible seating for Park's Newcomer classroom.

COMMUNITY BUILDING

Building a student's sense of civic pride begins with introducing them to the organizations and attractions that give our community its distinct character. This was accomplished with a variety of off-campus field trips, volunteer classroom visits and after school activities, each tailored to meet a particular need or interest of the students.

MENTORING


Because our community is wonderfully diverse, the needs of each student are unique, presenting teachers with a challenging teaching environment. One proven solution to address the problem is mentoring. While building relationships with individual students, our volunteers were able to focus time addressing their specific areas of concern, making tangible improvements especially in the area of reading proficiency.

- In partnership with Junior Achievement, Fidelity volunteers took to the classroom to share financial literacy lessons with students at Harry Street.
- In partnership with Kansas Big Brothers Big Sisters, employees were paired with students from Park and Harry Street to serve as mentors throughout the school year, visiting with their Littles weekly during the lunch hour.
- In partnership with United Way of the Plains, volunteer reading coaches met with their Read to Succeed buddy weekly for 20 minutes to practice skills and instill in them a love for reading.
